JULY MEETING - GUEST SPEAKER

Guest Speaker: Ben Young

Ben Young, is a regular Fairy Bower visitor and creator of the new phone app: Wildlife-ID. The app (for iPhone and Android) is a catalogue of animals found around Australia and is designed to assist non-scientists identify them based on more simple concepts like size and colour.

The app is for all animals across Australia, but Ben says that it is the precinct of Fairy Bower that was the inspiration for the app.

"I would often snorkel at the Bower, marvel at the amazing sea life but then sit on the beach wondering how to identify it. After searching high and low for an app to solve the problem, I figured I'll have to write one myself". Searching through "What x is that?" type books was slow going when they are sorted alphabetically, and I knew I only wanted to see "stripey yellow fish" - so the app is designed more that way.

Ben admits that he is not a professional photographer and so had to get photos from many external sources for the 2,000 species in the app, but many of his shots are taken in and around the waters of Fairy Bower.

"I made sure that Fairy Bower favourites like dusky whalers, giant cuttlefish, echidnas, eastern water dragons, blue gropers, cormorants and wobbygongs had to be included. Even rarer Bower visitors should all hopefully be included".

Ben spends much of his weekends at Manly and is often found snorkeling, diving, walking or jogging around North Head.

TO OUR FAIRY BOWER RESIDENTS

At our June meeting, the twenty five of us there wanted to make advance bookings at the revamped Le Kiosk! If the Boathouse at Shelly Beach is the successful lessee, we will be able to choose between eating ice cream in our swimmers and eating in a more formal, but still relaxed and 'beachy' setting. The precinct was pleased with the willingness of the 'likely lessee', Andrew Goldsmith to listen to our concerns around possible noise concerns. While the application process and refurbishment is in train, there's a handy coffee cart at the beach to give us a taste of what we can expect.

Ann Cameron, our Secretary and DA Coordinator, attended the Precinct Executive meeting organised by Council on 29 May 2014 where a very comprehensive presentation was given by Council's consultants on Manly 2015, in particular the proposed carparking solutions. The consultants presented the view that the removal of car parking and traffic from the central area to the periphery which involves the demolition of the Whistler St Car park, was critical to the success of Manly 2015 and could be financially

sustainable. This has become very contentious amongst the precincts and become very political. Rather than buy into the politics, our Precinct executive has opted to distance itself and allow Fairy Bower residents to make up their own minds and act accordingly.

Your current Fairy Bower precinct executive sees our role as working with Council to address issues of importance to our residents. We do not intend to sign up to any 'combined precinct' initiatives unless we agree with what has been proposed and the combined precinct meeting is sanctioned by and organized by Manly Council. We respect the right of other Precincts to do as they see fit but will not be included in 'Combined Precinct' motions to Council.

I look forward to seeing even more new residents at our next meeting when we learn even more about the marine life of Cabbage Tree Bay through a handy app.

JUNE MEETING

Boathouse at Shelly Presentation

A very informative presentation by the Boathouse team confirmed the following:

The DA before Council is for works only. No change to the operating hours (7am-midnight Mon – Sat and 7am -10pm Sun) seating capacity (as per current lease 260 capacity).

Main building works are to the back of house with new kitchen, store rooms, toilet, rear access and opening up ground floor of restaurant and café. The gardens to the rear will be upgraded with weed areas removed and more appropriate planting installed. Function area to remain the same except for increasing the size of the deck.

The café would be very relaxed and the restaurant a bit more 'grown up' with lots of produce displayed, licenced and BYO. It would be open 7 days a week and they hoped to be open in Oct/Nov 2014.

Those present were generally very supportive of the proposed works but asked Council to consider the following:

1. That an Acoustic Report be required;
2. That the rear walkway be covered to minimise noise transfer to adjoining residences;
3. That a Plan of Management include a requirement for guests to leave via the front of house/café in the late evenings;

4. That the hours of operation, capacity and any sub-lease conditions be included in the lease and DA conditions;
5. That Council include a requirement that the function room be made available for some community events e.g. precinct meetings; and
6. A copy of the lease agreement being made available for Precinct records.

Bower St Gully Reserve

It was agreed that in conjunction with the proposed works at the Boathouse rehabilitation work on this severely degraded area should be a Precinct focus.

Boat and Trailer Parking on Western side of Darley Rd

An item will be taken to the August Local Traffic Committee discussing extending the 2P residents permit zone to include the unrestricted parking on the west side of Darley Road.

Heritage Walk and Marine Parade Vegetation Management Plan

The Parks manager has photographed the areas as discussed at the site meeting and is now preparing a proposal to come back to the Precinct for consideration.

Community Garden

Council currently have no identified sites within the Fairy Bower Precinct for a Community Garden. However, Council would encourage the Precinct to put forward any options for
