## From our Chair

### Future Management of Cabbage Tree Bay

I can report that the long process of consultation and co-operation is beginning. On Monday 8th October 2007 Council moved unanimously to support the Coastline Committee recommendation that: "Council endorse staff to progress to the development of an Operational Agreement between Council, Department of Environment and Climate Change, and NSW Maritime for the management of Aquatic Reserves adjacent to the Manly LGA".

### Boats in the Bay

## From Robert Meredith:

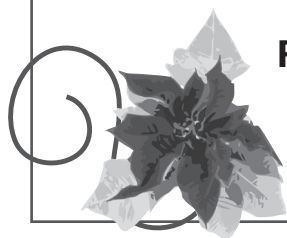

## Fairy Bower Precinct Community Forum Newsletter November 2007

### Fairy Bower Pool Repairs & Proposed Upgrade

Work on repairs and upgrade of Fairy Bower Pool is not due to start until winter next year. In the meantime, the Fairy Bower Precinct Community Forum met on October 8 and robust discussion was held about the proposed refurbishment of the Fairy Bower Pool. Several separate motions were put, and voted on, in order to clearly determine the views of the community as a whole.

It was noted that there had been a proposal in 1996 to upgrade and fence this pool. The community opposed it at the time. That proposal did not proceed.

Essentially, the meeting unanimously agreed that the community do want the following: basic repairs done to the floor of the pool and a safety rail installed on the inside edge of the pool (at no more than water height) adjacent to the Marine Parade walkway; a smooth but not level bottom surface of minimal thickness; a ladder installed on the outside of the Pool for access by snorkellers; and repairs to the concourse running alongside the walkway to create an even surface.

The meeting decided that Fairy Bower precinct community forum was against the proposed laying of a concrete concourse along the western end of Fairy Bower Pool and the proposed installation of accompanying safety fence along its edge. Simple repair of the broken pipe is the only work unanimously desired along that end of the Pool. The desire for more places to sit or lie after a swim was not considered a priority by the majority of attendees if it involved installing the long concrete concourse.

The precinct forum also formally requested that "Council staff consult with nominated Precinct representatives with regard to the final design of the pool upgrading works, in line with the wishes indicated by the Precinct".



### Consultation

Manly Mayor Peter Macdonald has since advised us that Council staff have assured him the planning of the works will be done in consultation with the Precinct as things progress. He explained in an email letter to the Chair of our forum that the DA had to be run past the Landscape Management and Urban Design Committee (CLUM) as a matter of course because there are "public design" issues involved. The concrete concourse was rejected at the recent meeting of that committee but it was suggested that the pipe be covered with a wooden boardwalk which could be extended beyond the eastern edge to end above deep water. The question of a safety fence may be non-negotiable on the basis of advice from Council's Risk Manager.

Peter further advises that the Fairy Bower Pool DA can be called up to a Council LUM meeting for inspection and further input from the community.

Thanks to all of those residents who attended the meeting and put their views.
