If you've had the chance to wander around our corner of Manly, you may have noticed the progress that has been made in projects that we have discussed and supported at Precinct meetings.

A wander up the steps between Shelly Beach and Bower St reveals the work that is proceeding apace at the Shelly Beach Boathouse. A peak over the fence reveals that landscaping work as well as construction work, is underway with hundreds of potted plants ready for planting along with many already in the new garden beds. At our April meeting, the lessee, Andrew Goldsmith will be our guest speaker, bringing us up to date with plans for the opening. There are many of us who can't wait to sit on the deck with a coffee or a glass of something crisp and white!

If you continue up the steps, you'll notice that Council has started clearing the rainforest undergrowth, in line with the current Council 'plan of action'. The area is looking much better now that 'rubbish' vegetation has been cleared

away. We have requested a meeting with Council to see how Precinct volunteers can be involved.

Included in this newsletter is an update on the Bower/ Reddall Sts Public Vistas program by John Lehmann. The iconic views have now largely been restored members of the public to enjoy. The Precinct's next step is to continue working with Council to rehabilitate the cliff face.

I enjoyed a long walk on North Head last weekend and noticed that the Sydney Harbour Federation Trust has replaced the signage. MANLY'S ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATION

Anzac Day celebrates and recognises those who serve in the armed forces, both past and present. The dawn services will be commemorating the serving forces as they have for the past 50 years over a (hopefully) beautiful sunrise. Manly's Anzac Day Commemoration takes place alongside the Manly Anzac War Memorial, one of the earliest and most striking monuments to the Anzacs in Sydney. Built in 1916, the monument represents a direct physical link to the times of the Great War.

The Commanding Officer of HMAS Penguin, Commander Paul Gall, will be special guest speaker at Manly Council's 2014 Anzac Day Commemoration and Wreath Laying Ceremony. There will be an opportunity for private wreaths to be laid at the Manly Anzac War Memorial after the Official Wreath Laying Ceremony.

In the event of rain, the Service will be held at St Matthews Church, The Corso, Manly.

IMPROVING PUBLIC VISTAS

In the past the public enjoyed largely unimpeded vistas and the iconic views from the public viewing platforms at the end of Bower and Redall Streets, and on the pathways and steps to Marine parade.

These vistas and iconic views have been lost due to the excessive growth from a large number of trees including the paperbarks, the non-native, prolific growing and invasive Kaffir Plum, the rapid growth of the larger Figs and the emergence of a large number of smaller Figs and seedlings sprouting up everywhere.

There is an existing Council tree management program that provides for the biannual trimming of some of the paperbarks on Marine Parade and this was expanded at the suggestion of the Precinct in 2014. Other essential works identified include the restoration works for the barren and dangerous escarpment areas adjacent to the pathway and steps to Marine Parade. The pruning of trees and the removal of the invasive Kaffir Plum works needed to be carried out first to enable the escarpment restoration works to be done.

The contractor has almost completed the tree pruning and removal of several nominated species. The improved vistas can be seen coming down Bower and Redall Streets, at the street ends overlooking the beach, and along the Heritage walkways and steps. There are some minor pruning works that the precinct will ask to be done to complete the tree management works. The Precinct's next step is to liaise with Council on the escarpment restoration works.

The Precinct is very appreciative of the open and co-operative sessions with, and support from, the Council, and in particular from Fenton Beatty who made himself available and provided information throughout the process.



e-Waste – Banned from General Clean Up Collections in Manly

- E-waste is defined as all televisions, desktop and portable computers, monitors, mice, keyboards, cables, drives, printers, scanners and computer related peripherals.
- E-waste is no longer accepted in kerbside collections in the Manly, Mosman, Warringah and Pittwater Council areas.
- E-waste contains toxic materials such as arsenic, cadmium and mercury which are hazardous to humans and the natural environment.
- Recycling e-waste prevents pollution and recovers rare natural resources for re-use.
