## NORTH HEAD WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

Sydney Water has advised that over the next few months they are cleaning and refurbishing one of the three digesters on North Head. The digesters are large tanks that produce biosolids. This includes taking a digester out of service temporarily. Sydney Water have advised that the community may notice and increase in odour and extra truck movements during the first stage of the work which should be finished by mid June. It will then take another six months to refurbish the digester.

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## MAIN COUNCIL REONSES

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### Marine Parade Masterplan:

Council has advised that a \$200,000 grant application was successful. This grant is a 50/50 grant and requires Council to contribute in funding and in kind an additional \$200,000. This additional allocation will be considered in the budgetary discussions towards the adoption of the 2015-2016 budget. Following decisions on the funding, the draft Marine Parade master plan will be reviewed in the first instance by the Public Domains committee, along with the previous recommendations for Marine Parade as made by this Committee to Council.

Precinct Motion - THAT Council invite a representative of Fairy Bower Precinct to join the Public Domains Committee to assist in the preparation of the draft Marine Parade Masterplan and to report back to the Precinct on a regular basis.

### Redall Street to Bower Street public vistas proposal:

The remaining works include: thinning of trees at the end of Bower Street and the Fig Tree on the escarpment from Redall Street as listed in the agreed document. Due to the storm these works have been delayed and are due to be carried out over the winter period as there is less activity in this location then.

The escarpment will be vegetated in line with current regeneration program and species suitable for the location. The escarpment work will be programmed over the winter period when there are less people around as access will be easier.

Precinct Comment - The Precinct would like to know what species are deemed suitable in this location. The recent storms have highlighted the importance of ground cover to stabilize the cliff face and reduce the potential for damage in the future.

### Redall Street Island – Pruning of Oleanders and Vegetation:

These pruning works have been delayed due to storm damage clean up, this will be carried out as soon as possible.

Precinct Comment - The suitability of oleanders in this location was questioned by one resident.

### Fairy Bower Pool:

The condition of the pool has been assessed several times. This pool has a natural stone bottom and so it will always have some areas that are not smooth under foot. The pool is cleaned every 2 weeks throughout the summer months to keep the pool clean and safe.

Precinct Request - That during the summer months the pool be cleaned weekly – it was noted that the ocean pools in Warringah Shire are all cleaned weekly during summer.

### Bower Street Car Park Steps:

Council plans to replace the stairs with new sandstone stairs. Work to replace these stairs is anticipated to be undertaken in June / July with completion by August 2015.

### Marine Parade – Seepage from 38/40 Bower Street onto Marine Parade Walkway:

The Environmental Health team have not received any requests of such matter. Council is unable to provide any details as no investigation has been carried out. Residents who are concerned about any potential sewage issues should report them directly to Council at records@manly.nsw.gov.au. to ensure a prompt investigation.

Precinct Response - Could Council please investigate further (surely this request can be referred to the Environmental Health Team) as we believe it is a health and safety issue and that a public risk assessment is needed.

## MANLY FOOD CO-OPERATIVE

Following an incredible effort by at least 100 volunteers, the Manly Food Co-Operative has proudly opened its doors at our new location of 15a Whistler Street Manly. 100% community owned and operated, the Manly Food Co-Op was started in 1996 by a group of dedicated volunteers and has been run entirely by volunteers for most of its 18 years. The Manly Food Co-Op strives to be a forerunner in sustainable business in the local community.

The foundations of the Manly Food Co-Op are sustainability in 3 areas:

1. Waste reduction- 99% of our products are available to buy in bulk or with minimal packaging
2. Organic- 99% of our products are organic and our fresh produce supports Australian organic farmers
3. Community owned and operated- 100% of profits are reinvested back into the co-op to continually improve and develop this community business.

Remarkably, in the past 12 months, the Manly Food Co-Op has developed financially and has been able to employ 3 paid staff with the possibility of creating further jobs in the next 12 months.

Not only is this excellent community business creating jobs in the local community, the Manly Food Co-Op gives a huge amount back to our community through connecting like minded people, offering volunteer opportunities for members to increase and diversify their skill set, providing education to the broader community about waste reduction and environmental sustainability, promoting other small and local business through working partnerships and providing a sustainable and ethical shopping alternative for consumers in Manly and the wider area.

The Manly Food Co-Op is more than just a place to shop. It provides our community with a place to get involved, get creative, and get educated. In our fast paced society where everything is instant and busy, the Food Co-Op offers people a chance to take a new perspective. Members come in and have a cup of tea and a chat while they shop, it's a place to connect, to find out about what's happening in our area with our community notice board, we offer talks and workshops about food and health and we offer volunteers and members regular social catch ups.
