FAIRY BOWER PRECINCT – YOUR COMMUNITY AT WORK.

February saw the culmination of two Precinct projects, one that had been five years in the making and one whose gestation was a little shorter.

BOWER STREET 40KM SPEED LIMIT

Precinct member Roger Band has worked tirelessly as the our representative, working with both Council and the Roads and Maritime to have 40km signs erected in Bower St. Those of us who live in Bower St or drive along it regularly are frequently frustrated by drivers who don't acknowledge that they are in a narrow residential street. It is impossible to legislate against stupidity but it is hoped that the reduced speed limit helps to make Bower St safer for residents and visitors alike. The 5th March is 'Signs Up' day! Thank you Roger for your work on this project.

CLIFF FACE ABOVE THE SURF CLUB, BETWEEN REDDALL AND BOWER

John Lehmann's, research showed that two of the plants were invasive species and their removal and the thinning of other vegetation would result in the opening up of the Public Vistas from the steps. Council agreed with the Precinct and our advice was transformed into a plan to open up the views once again. We are still working with Council to ensure that the cliff face is revegetated, preventing further erosion.

WHAT'S NEXT

2015-2016 BUDGET BIDS

At our February meeting we revisited the projects we had nominated over the past few years. We determined that the following three projects were important to us, representing two major and ongoing projects and one that is much more easily funded and achieved but none the less important.

The following notes are from our application to Council.

REGENERATION OF CLIFF FACE BETWEEN REDDALL AND BOWER STREETS

We have nominated this project in previous years. We appreciate the work that the Council has already completed and want to press for further work, especially in the area from the point around to Bower Lane.

Precinct representatives are happy to meet with Council representatives to discuss Council's existing plans and what might be possible. We would like to be able to inform the Precinct the Council's plans for this area.

MASTER PLAN FOR MARINE PARADE

We appreciate Council's commitment to include the Precinct in any plans for the rejuvenation and renovation of Marine

parade and we are keen that a plan be developed so that when funds become available Council is 'ready to go'.

BRAILLE INFORMATION STRIPS ON THE SCULPTURES ALONG MARINE PARADE

MARINE PARADE IDEAS WALK

Last Sunday morning a group of nine interested residents came for a walk along Marine Parade and discussed what we would like to see included in – or excluded from – Manly Council's renovation and upgrade of Marine Parade.

There was general agreement about many of the major items and some different ideas from individuals. We agreed that council should do some of these things as maintenance, without waiting for a major project.

Repair of drainage systems and seawall will obviously be an essential and expensive part of the project.

Paving – Everyone wants to see an even surface on the walkway as well as resurfacing of the narrow concrete strip around the pool and along the access-ways to the rocks and water around the Bower Lane area. The boat ramp at Shelly Beach also needs resurfacing. There was a suggestion for a marine design in the paving at both ends and Bower Lane area. Possibly coloured stone or marble as seen in King's Park, Perth.

Signage – Everyone wants minimum signage. The “No bikes at weekends” signs are generally ignored, but we could not think of a way to do it better, other than by more policing by rangers.

Lights and Poles – Most important is putting all the wires underground (for safety as well as appearance) and moving all the light poles to the landward side of the path. There was a suggestion for installing the same lights as along the Steyne and another of returning to the traditional poles long ago removed.

We were concerned that the poles and wires around the new Boatshed Restaurant at Shelly Beach go underground.

Cliff Face – This should be part of council's regular maintenance. Thorough weeding and replanting is needed in many places as well as work to prevent erosion and trap seepage and run-off before it gets to the walkway.

Fairy Bower Pool - It is in need of thorough resurfacing of the floor of the pool, as well as the narrow edge around it. No fence wanted on seaward side.

Bins – most happy with current number of bins but one would like to see more.

From Individuals:

Sculptures on the rocks by the path – these are very popular and one would like to see more of them.

Seating –

suggestion for some continuous seating as in photo.

suggestion that we remove and discourage more of these.
